- 2023 Financial Statements were audited by Scarrow & Donald in accordance with MHC Bylaws.
- 2. Encouraging to see growth in membership numbers and sponsorship which indicate our initiatives to attract and retain members and partners are successful.
- 3. MHC has begun rebuilding our cash reserves which were depleted with the barn asphalt floor project in 2022.
- 4. Before the addition of amortization, our revenue/expense statement for 2023 was break-
- 5. Sport Manitoba core funding remained stable for 2023.
- 6. Program support grants were reallocated to athlete development.
- 7. MHC has been successful in accessing funding from sources in addition to Sport Manitoba grants including: \$25,000 small capital grant and \$11,000 special initiative grant from Arts, Culture, Sports and Community fund plus \$5290 from Canada Summer Games Legacy Grant for online learning system.

Appointment of Auditors
