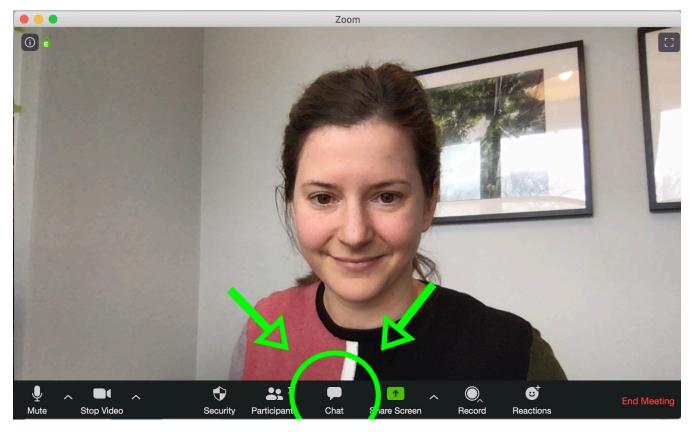

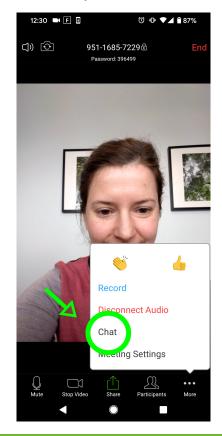

1.2 Executive Director's Report



- Membership held steady with a total of 1,707 vs 1,712 in 2018, with a slight shift towards the competitive categories
- There was also an increase in the uptake of optional insurance
- The Equestrian Facility had a successful season and the Facilities Committee was very active and involved
- Great headway was made in organizing the coaching files and preparing the way for the Coach Licensing Program, set for implementation this year
- Despite our minimal staffing, the office held to a full time schedule and maintained a standard for prompt responses to all inquiries

1.2 Executive Director's Report



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- In early June, the Sport Manitoba computer systems were breached and remained out of action for nearly three months
- Maintaining records without access to files proved a serious challenge and set us back in our financial reporting and other major projects
- The Operations Deficit reported in the Audited Statements is the result of 2018 expenditures and grant payouts being reported in 2019
- The IFF funding report was presented to Sport Manitoba in February, projecting a slight increase in membership and revenues together with increased office staffing to meet the increasing workload we face

The Impact of COVID-19



- At the end of February, our 2020 membership renewals were on track with last year
- In March, we fell behind, and if that trend continues, we will fall short of last year's total by 400 members
- With the delay in the start of competition, we also face a potential loss of revenue at the Equestrian Facility
- We are recasting our financial projections and working closely with Sport Manitoba on financial relief and programs available through both the Federal and Provincial Governments
- While the outcome of the next few months is uncertain, we are reviewing our 2020 budget projections to avoid being caught off guard

Re-forecasting our Budget



Please note: these are projections only. There is much that is still not clear. The purpose of casting these numbers is to make sure we are prepared to sustain our operation if we sustain a significant drop in revenues.

It is also important to bear in mind that MHC has adequate cash reserves, but our aim will be to avoid depleting those resources.

Not taken into account are government support programs, which could provide support of up to \$80,000, thereby eliminating any potential deficit. These programs include an employment subsidy of 75% of salaries and wages, business loans and business subsidies.

We were assured last week that the Operations Grant and Program Support (Bingo Money) would remain in place. However, the CEO of Sport Manitoba is meeting with the Minister of Sport and Culture this week, and we hope to have more information soon.

Re-Forecasting our Budget



Membership Revenue Budget

With adjustments to variable costs and overall revenues (excluding the Facility) reduced by \$51,875, the deficit is projected to be \$22,197.

With adjustments to variable costs and revenues of \$37,033, the Facility is projected to have an operating deficit of \$26,195.

Hugh Crawley, MHC Treasurer



- Our general account balance was \$94,603.96 as of Dec. 31, 2019, compared with \$123,477.01 on Dec. 31, 2018
- \$20,000 was allocated to the facilities account to save for Equestrian Facility improvements
- Additional major expenditures in 2020 included the lease of an RTV and the purchase of a pallet/bale fork, bleachers and picnic tables.
- We netted \$3,000 from the 50:50 lottery



- Audited statements show a loss of approx. \$12,000; the variance is due to the allocation of approx. \$7,500 of 2018-19 MLCC grant money and the previous year's Cavalia income
- 2019 shows a practical deficit of \$5,000 dollars, which is acceptable considering the major investments made at the Equestrian Facility

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- We have seen a significant drop off in 2020 memberships given the delay of various equestrian activities – this will have an adverse impact on revenue
- Provincial funding is uncertain
- The Board would prefer to maintain both its employees and the maintenance contract for the Equestrian Facility if finances allow
- We encourage member clubs to make use of the Facility for events, clinics, workshops or competitions when circumstances allow

Financials as of Mar. 31, 2020



One of the most significant expenses in early 2020 was the purchase of refreshed merchandise, which was planned to debut at the Winter Fair.

1.6.1 Coaching Update



- We have 69 Registered Certified Coaches
- We have had 70 participants in clinics/workshops offered
- 12 Clinics/workshops were offered by MHC, including:
 - Yves Rossier Clean Sport presentation
 - (2) Coach Licensing, The Law and Insurance (with Mike King, CapriCMW and Bruce King, Pitblado Hoskins) were two highlights of 2019
 - NCCP Equestrian Theory
 - Coaching Camp (Oct 2019)
 - English and Western Coaching Evaluations
- We certified 2 New Coaches in 2019
- Implementing Safe Sport policies inline with Sport MB and National protocols

1.6.1 Coaching Priorities for 2020



- Advise each coach of the status of their records to ensure they are current and to help prepare them for coach licensing
- Offer 1 English and 1 Western Evaluation event, 1 English and 1
 Western Update event, two 3-day multi-module coach camps (Brandon and Winnipeg) and a Coach Appreciation Workshop
- Host a Rookie Rider Instructor Training workshop
- Continue preparing Manitoba Coaches for EC Coach Licensing
- Continue to reach out to past coaches to help get them into the new system

1.6.3 Marketing Update



- Memberships lagging behind 2019 due to present circumstances.
 Marketing efforts will focus on the sale of Recreation memberships, and we will encourage with monthly contests.
- Striving to provide benefits to members beyond insurance coverage through Partners Program initiative (discounts and special offers to MHC members).
- Horse Day (June 6, 2020) will likely be digital this year.
- Post COVID-19, focus on implementing new marketing plan, with a focus on engaging youth and adults with the "horsey gene" and getting them into lesson programs.

1.6.5 Competitions Update



- 17 EC sanctioned competitions were held in 2019: 9 Hunter/Jumper,
 6 Dressage, 1 Eventing and 1 Breed, along with a variety of competitions in many disciplines
- Introduced new format for 2019 Multi Discipline Team Challenge: 10 riders on 8 teams collected points in their respective disciplines
 - 2020 MDTC: scheduled for Sept 25-27
 - Areas of improvement: Bring in a sound system to communicate with barns; possibly move event weekend for 2021
- Equestrian Canada has suspended all EC sanctioned competitions until June 1 due to COVID-19; we are monitoring the situation closely
- 2020 focus: Developing the Heritage Show Circuit program

1.6.6 Equestrian Facility



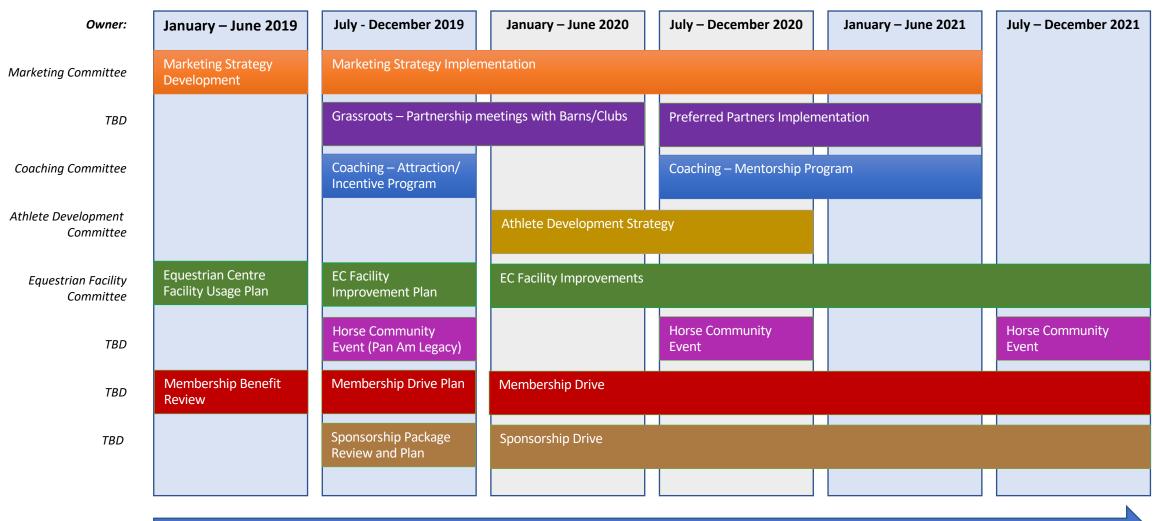
- Our hero and "Facility Santa" Kelly Roe has once again returned in his role as the Facility Manager for 2020.
