



## 2014 Canadian Interprovincial Championship (CIEC) Qualification process for Manitoba athletes

### What is the CIEC?

The Canadian Interprovincial Equestrian Championships is a sanctioned Equine Canada competition. This team event offers athletes in the *Learning and Training to Compete* and the *Learning and Training to Win* stages within the Long-Term Equestrian Development (LTED) model, the opportunity to test their skills against their peers from across Canada.

Recognized as a pilot project, the Canadian Interprovincial Equestrian Championships is a collaborative event between the national and provincial sport organizations governing equestrian competition, whereby provincial/territorial sport organizations field teams representing their respective province/territory. It also acts a key event in the development of equestrian's next generation of national, international and world champions. In addition, it is a platform for talent identification for athletes, coaches and officials.

The disciplines of Dressage, Jumping and Reining classes for both Junior and Senior riders are available for entry. Nine Provincial /Territorial Sport Organizations (PTSOs) were represented by teams of athletes at the inaugural event that was held in 2012 in conjunction with the Quebec Equestrian Games (Jeux équestres du Québec) in Bromont.

Horses are made available for lease where shipping horses is too costly or logistically difficult for a P/TSO.

The 2014 championships will build on the 2013 edition, with many provinces expected to field teams. The 2014 CIEC will be hosted by the Fédération équestre du Québec at the Parc équestre de Blainville.

### DISCIPLINES

#### Dressage Specific Technical Conditions

##### Venue

The Dressage, Jumping and Reining events will take place at:

Le Parc équestre de Blainville

The Dressage and Jumping events will be outdoors, the Reining event will be indoors.

Meals will be made available for purchase on site for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

##### Competition and practice arenas

Sand; arena dimensions: 20 x 60 m

### Dressage Championships

Athletes will compete at First Level Tests 2 & 3 over three days of Competition. EC Dressage Tests will be used.

Day 1 - Test 2

Day 2 - Test 3

Day 3 - Test 3

### Athlete Eligibility Restrictions:

An athlete is not eligible to compete at the CIEC if he/she has competed above Second Level in the current year.

Whips are not permitted.

Test Callers are not permitted.

All Tests must be ridden from memory.

### Horse Eligibility Restrictions:

A horse is not eligible to compete at the CIEC if it has competed above Second Level in the current year.

Leased horses may be exempt from this restriction at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.

Stallions may be shown by SENIOR ATHLETES ONLY.

### **Jumping Specific Technical Conditions**

#### Venue

#### Competition arena

Sand; arena dimensions: 75 X 90 m

#### Practice arena

Sand; arena dimensions: 70 X 42 m

### Jumping Championships

Athletes will compete at the 1.10 m level over three days of Competition. Specifically,

Day 1 – CIEC Welcome Jumper class will be run under Table A - FEI Article 238.2.2 as a one round with an immediate jump off where no faults were incurred in the first round.

Day 2 – CIEC Speed Jumper class will be run under Table A - FEI Article 238.2.1 as a one round against the clock. In the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other athletes are placed according to their penalties and time in the first round.

Day 3 – CIEC Mini Prix Jumper class will be run under Table A - FEI Article 238.2.2 with return jump off for competitors clear in the first round.

### Athlete Eligibility Restrictions:

An athlete is not eligible to compete at the CIEC if he/she has competed above the 1.20 m level in the current year.

### Horse Eligibility Restrictions:

A horse is not eligible to compete at the CIEC if it has competed above the 1.20 m level in the current year.

Leased horses may be exempt from this restriction at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.

Stallions may be shown by SENIOR ATHLETES ONLY.

### **Reining Specific Technical Conditions**

#### Venue

The Dressage, Jumping and Reining events will take place at:

#### Competition and practice arenas

Sand; arena dimensions: 22 X 65 m

#### Reining Championships

Athletes will compete in three Reining Patterns over three days of Competition.

Day 1 – Pattern # 4

Day 2 – Pattern # 6

Day 3 – Pattern # 9

#### Athlete Eligibility Restrictions:

An Athlete must have obtained a minimum score of 65 at a P/TSO qualifier competition in the current year.

An Athlete is not eligible to compete in the CIEC if he/she has competed at the Reining Championships for Junior or Young Athletes at the NAJYRC in the current year.

Senior athletes whose names appear on the NRHA 2014 ineligibility lists as a Limited Non-Pro or Rookie Pro are not eligible to compete.

#### Horse Eligibility Restrictions:

A horse is not eligible to compete at the CIEC if it has competed at the Reining Championships for Junior or Young Athletes at the NAJYRC in the current year.

Leased horses may be exempt from this restriction at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.

Stallions may be shown by SENIOR ATHLETES ONLY.

### **Team Size**

Each provincial or territorial discipline team must be composed of a minimum of 2 riders and a maximum of 4 riders. For teams of 2 riders, one must be a junior and one must be a senior. For teams of 3 riders, at least one must be a junior and at least one must be a senior. For teams of 4 riders, two must be juniors and two must be seniors. If in the

event where a P/TA cannot enter a full team, individual athletes may represent a P/TSO. Each P/TSO that cannot enter a team may enter one or two individual competitors (in each division) with one horse each. Points earned by individual competitors will count only towards Individual Awards.

### **Manitoba Qualification Process**

The Manitoba Horse Council has worked in collaboration with our member clubs to determine the 2014 CIEC qualification process.

#### Dressage:

For Dressage Winnipeg (DW) members: Using the highest scores in First Level or Second Level of DW 2014 shows,  
For Westman Dressage (WD) members: Using scores from the September 2013 show, including the training level if they are completing at 1<sup>st</sup> this year and July 2014 show scores using the 1<sup>st</sup> and second level tests.

Final team selection will be determined by Manitoba Horse Council.

#### Jumping:

Jumping at a minimum height of 1.10m and a maximum height of 1.20m  
Results submitted for final selection must be from 3/9 of the following shows:  
Royal Manitoba Winter Fair, Wheat City Classic, Manitoba Summer Fair, Victoria Day Show, Ride of Rides, Summer Smiles, Beach Party, Marcy Schweizer, Heart of the Continent  
Riders competing for team placement must not compete above 1.20m in 2014.

Final team selection will be determined by Manitoba Horse Council.

#### Reining:

An Athlete must have obtained a minimum score of 65 at a P/TSO qualifier competition in the current year. 2014 qualifying shows area as follows: CCRHA Spring Classic, Wheat City Reining Derby, Rudko Summer Slide and Pine Ridge Summer Sizzler.

An Athlete is not eligible to compete in the CIEC if he/she has competed at the Reining Championships for Junior or Young Athletes at the NAJYRC in the current year.

Senior athletes whose names appear on the NRHA 2014 ineligibility lists as a Limited Non-Pro or Rookie Pro are not eligible to compete.

Final team selection will be determined by Manitoba Horse Council

### **Selection Process**

The Manitoba Horse Council, in consultation with participating member clubs, will determine the final teams based on the following criteria:

- Complete applications received by the application process deadline
- Show results from qualification competitions
- Current MHC Membership in good standing
- Athletes must reside in Manitoba

## **Fees to Participate**

\$2000 per athlete (includes transportation, accommodations, entry fees, team uniforms, coaching honorariums)

\$1300 per athlete (leased horse fee)

\$3300 total
